Background





- On May 3rd, a 2-year-old child was attacked by a coyote in District 10
- Response:
 - DAS called in USDA Wildlife Services and the City of Dallas' Urban Wildlife Biologist
 - Four coyotes removed & tested for rabies
 - All tested negative
 - Coyote Hotline created for information gathering
 - 275 calls received within Dallas
 - 40 calls received outside of Dallas
 - Neighborhood meetings held in District 10 & 14
 - Coyote Management Plan shared with District 10 on June 13th
 - Drafted Anti-Feeding Ordinance



Purpose



- Goals of the ordinance:
 - Reduce habituation of coyotes and other wildlife
 - Prevent human interactions with rabies vector species
 - Avoid property damage
 - Increase resident safety

- Types of problematic behaviors the ordinance addresses:
 - Overflowing, unkept bird feeders
 - Free-feeding of community cats
 - Leaving trash or food scraps out for wildlife



Draft Ordinance



SEC. 7-3.6. FEEDING OF ANIMALS PROHIBITED; EXCEPTIONS.

- (a) A person commits an offense if he/she intentionally feeds or makes food available for animal consumption to any animal(s) in a manner that:
 - (1) Creates a danger to public health or safety;
 - (2) Destroys public or private property;
 - (3) Causes more than ten adult animals to congregate in one location at the same time; or
 - (4) Attracts, habituates or socializes wildlife to humans.
- (a) This ordinance shall not apply to:
 - (1) Community or feral cat colonies registered with the City of Dallas, provided they are following Dallas Animal Services' guidelines and best practices
 - Wild bird feeders filled in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations within the boundaries of a person's owned or occupied property; overflowing bird feeders may be in violation of this ordinance.
- (a) It is a defense to prosecution under Subsection (e) that the person is a licensed veterinarian, a peace officer, or a person employed by the Department, the state, or a political subdivision of the state who is acting pursuant to a lawfully authorized program to manage animal populations and who is acting within the scope of the person's duties and authority.

BACKGROUND

To better support small business operators following the COVID19 pandemic, City of Dallas Code Compliance is seeking approval to reduce certain fees associated with the mobile food industry. Informed by the City of Dallas 2021 Fee Study on Mobile Food Units (MFU), Code Compliance is revising fees to mirror the 2020 fee schedule rates through the end of FY 2022. This action requires no fee refunds.

The temporary fee roll back represents a reduction in revenue of \$86,277 based on the service volumes reported in the City of Dallas 2021 Fee Study. The fee roll back would impact the application fee and inspection fee related to Class II, III and IV mobile food units and the plan review fee for Class III and IV mobile food units.

Below is the breakdown of this action showing the name of the fees, the current fees, the proposed fees, the current budget revenue, the revenue to be collected until September 2022 and the revenue foregone.

Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DALLAS:

SECTION 1. That Subsection (d), "Permit Application Fee," of Section 17-10.2, "Additional Requirements," of Article X, "Compliance and Enforcement," of Chapter 17, "Food Establishments," of the Dallas City Code, is amended to read as follows:

"(d) Permit application fee.

- (1) An applicant for a permit for a food establishment shall pay the city an application fee for each separate and distinct fixed facility and for each mobile food <u>unit</u> [preparation vehicle] inside the city from which the establishment is to be operated.
- (2) <u>Effective until September 30, 2022, t[</u>T]he applicant shall pay a nonrefundable fee according to the following schedule:

SECTION 2. That Subparagraph (A) of Paragraph (2), "Mobile Food Unit," of Subsection (g), "Annual Inspection Fees: Catering Services and Mobile Food Establishments," of Section 17-10.2, "Additional Requirements," of Article X, "Compliance and Enforcement," of Chapter 17, "Food Establishments," of the Dallas City Code, is amended to read as follows:

"(A) Effective until September 30, 2022, a food establishment that operates a mobile food unit inside the city shall pay the city a nonrefundable annual inspection fee in accordance with the following schedule:

SECTION 3. That, unless specifically provided otherwise by this ordinance or by state law, a person violating a provision of this ordinance is, upon conviction, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.

SECTION 4. That Chapter 17 of the Dallas City Code shall remain in full force and effect, save and except as amended by this ordinance.

SECTION 5. That any act done or right vested or accrued, or any proceeding, suit, or prosecution had or commenced in any action before the amendment or repeal of any ordinance, or part thereof, shall not be affected or impaired by amendment or repeal of any ordinance, or part thereof, and shall be treated as still remaining in full force and effect for all intents and purposes

as if the amended or repealed ordinance, or part thereof, had remained in force.

SECTION 6. That the terms and provisions of this ordinance are severable and are governed by Section 1-4 of Chapter 1 of the Dallas City Code, as amended.

SECTION 7. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City of Dallas, and it is accordingly so ordained.
